To Thomas Middleton Esq^r

Whereas in the present situation of affairs, it is thought necessary for the immediate protection of the several Settlements of this Province, to raise a Regiment of Foot, to consist of one thousand Men, under Officers into which the three provincial Companies, called the Buffs, shall be incorporated, as part of the said Regiment: And In providing especial Trust and Confidence in the Loyalty Courage and Good Conduct of You the said Thomas Middleton, His Excellency has been pleased to constitute and appoint, and these presents do constitute and appoint you the said Thomas Middleton to be Colonel of the said Regiment: which said Regiment you are to lead Train, Muster and exercise, according to Military Discipline, and you are to follow and observe all such orders and Instructions as you shall receive from time to time, received from me or the Commander in Chief for the time being, according to the Rules and discipline of War, and the performance of the Trust hereby reposed in You, and all other Officers and Soldiers belonging to the said Regiment, and hereby strictly required & commanded to obey You as Colonel of the same.

This Commission to continue during Pleasure.
